



Councillor David Grant was appointed as Chairperson of the Town Council and Mayor of Horwich for 2023-2024. David Grant was brought up and raised in Horwich mainly on Singleton Avenue. He attended Lord Street Primary School (now Beacon) and then went to Rivington & Blackrod High School. David was a keen long-distance runner competing in runs throughout Horwich & Rivington. He is a supporter of Bolton Wanderers and a member of the Supporter's Trust.

David worked in finance for both the BBC and ABN Amro commercial bank. Married to Dr Kathryn Grant, his wife of almost 14 years, they have 2 boys who are avid football players.

David has always helped within his community becoming Vice Chair of Friends Of Star Lodge and started an active role in politics in 2019 when he joined Horwich & Blackrod First Independents, where he won his seat in Vale ward on Horwich Town Council. David won his seat in Horwich and Blackrod Ward on Bolton Borough council in 2021 and went on to became Leader of the party in 2022 following the resignation of the founding party leader.

In 2022 he was appointed as Deputy Mayor of Horwich, and following his success in the all-out Borough elections where he was elected to all three of Horwich, Blackrod and Bolton councils, he was selected to be Mayor of Horwich for 2023/2024 civic year.

David's charities for his civic year are Sam's Warriors (who offer a befriending service through running, walking and yoga to assist in mental health and wellbeing), Rock-it! (a charity to engage the local youth through music building confidence in a safe environment), and Veteran's Army which is a charity which helps military veterans with support, training and counselling, as well as currently helping with aid in Ukraine.

The Town Mayor will be supported during his year of office by his wife Councillor Kathryn Grant who will be Town Mayoress for 2023 – 24.

Deputy Mayor of Horwich 2023-2024

Councillor Ian Aldcroft was appointed as Deputy Town Mayor for 2023 - 24 with his wife Janet as Deputy Town Mayoress.

Ian Aldcroft was born in Manchester, England, in 1953. He moved to Radcliffe on Trent at the age of three and then to Eastwood near Nottingham. In 1963, he moved to Culcheth and attended Newton-le-Willows Grammar School while living there.



In 1991, Ian joined United Utilities, where he mostly worked in knowledge management. He retired early at the age of 63 in 2016.



New plaque at former Black Bull Pub



A new civic plaque has been installed at the Rivington Grill on Church Street. Formerly the Black Bull Public House, this distinctive stone building has existed for over 200 years. In the 18th - 19th centuries it was a stage coach inn and in the early 19th century it was the centre of administration for the original village of Horwich presided over by Joseph Ridgway.

The plaque reads:

Former Site of The Black Bull Public House, A stagecoach inn circa 1750 and centre of local administration for the original village of Horwich 1800 - 1850
